We are progressing with the following over the next coming weeks:

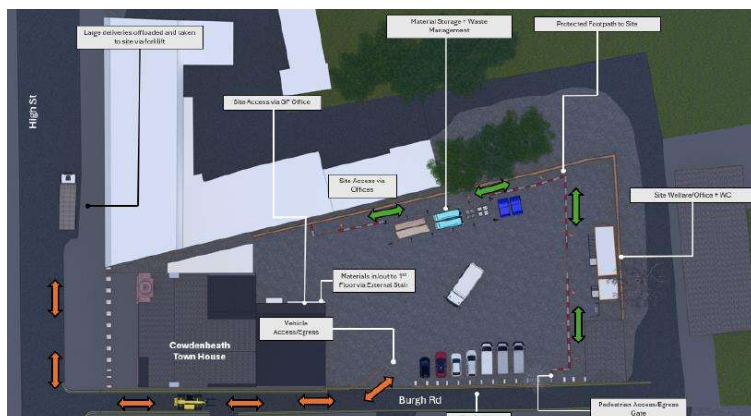
- Partitions 2nd fix partitions
